



Psychology Minor – Undergraduate

Requirements of the Psychology Minor

A minor in Psychology consists of 18 hours of Psychology courses including:

***Twelve hours of the minor coursework must be at the 300 level or above. Nine hours of the 300 level or above minor coursework must be completed in residency at KU. To complete the Psychology Minor students must have a 2.0 GPA, or above, in all of their psychology classes.**

Elective courses may include any undergraduate courses offered by the Department of Psychology including PSYC 480 - Independent Study, PSYC 481 - Research Practicum, and PSYC 483 - Undergraduate Internship in Psychology. A maximum of 3 hours of PSYC 480, 3 hours of 481, or 3 hours of 483 may count toward the minor.

In the semester before graduation students must obtain a **Minor Certification Sheet** from our department advising specialist and meet with a department faculty member for review and signature on the Minor Certification Sheet.

TRANSFER CREDITS IN PSYCHOLOGY

Transfer course work in psychology may also be credited toward the completion of your minor requirements provided the courses were taken in the Department of Psychology of your former college or university and were essentially equivalent to courses required for the major in our Department. If you are transferring credits from another university, you must first have these approved through the College. The Director of Undergraduate Studies in Psychology can then clarify whether a transfer course will be credited toward your major/minor in psychology. Before a final decision is made regarding such matters, you will be asked to assemble materials that help in evaluating your course work, such as the course syllabus, topics covered and the author and title of the text used in the course.
