Dr. Margaret Beale Spencer's research focuses on the effects of ethnicity, gender, and race on youth and adolescent development. Since 2009 she has served as the Marshall Field IV Professor of Urban Education in the Department of Comparative Human Development at the University of Chicago. She was the recipient of the 2005 American Psychological Association's Award for Distinguished Contributions to Psychology in the Public Interest.

Dr. Spencer's career spans more than 30 years and consists of over 115 published articles and chapters, stemming from work funded by over two-dozen foundations and federal agencies.

Dr. Margaret Beale Spencer is a KU Alumna, having received her master's degree from the University of Kansas Psychology Department.
